NATA Urges East Hampton Town Board to Reconsider and Repeal Restrictions on Aviation Businesses Operating at Airport

Last week, NATA submitted a [letter](#) to the East Hampton Town Supervisor Board urging it to reconsider and repeal its recently approved restrictions at the East Hampton Airport (HTO). The letter was written in response to the Council's May 7th hearing which considered additional changes to the recently approved restrictions including the adoption of penalties. In March, NATA and other major general aviation associations submitted [comments](#) to the East Hampton Town Board in opposition to the town's proposal to restrict operations at HTO, and its related airport infrastructure plan. In the letter, NATA Senior Vice President for Government Affairs, Bill Deere, stated, "The imposition and structure of the restrictions will have a detrimental impact on HTO-based aviation businesses and others operating into the airport and will result in reduced local revenues, investment, and job loss."
