On behalf of the membership of the National Air Transportation Association (NATA), I write to express strong support for the proposal to fund critical modernization of our nation's air traffic control (ATC) system, which is scheduled to be considered by the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee on April 30, 2025.

NATA appreciates the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee's continued prioritization of the safety of the National Airspace System (NAS) and the flying public. Under your leadership, the Committee has demonstrated a bipartisan commitment to sound aviation policies that strengthen the U.S. civil aviation industry and benefit all users of the NAS. The proposed \$15 billion investment in our ATC systems, infrastructure, and staffing continues that legacy and builds on the many achievements of the landmark FAA Reauthorization Act of 2024.
